

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL SESSION OF THE MARCELINE CITY COUNCIL
June 8, 2020

The Marceline City Council met in special session on June 8, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, Mayor Sallie Buck presiding. Council members present were Jeri Holt, Tyson Brammer, Liz Cupp, and Lacey Meissen and newly elected Councilman Gary Carlson. Staff attending: City Manager Richard Hoon and City Clerk Lindsay Krumpelman. Others Present: Stephen Carlson, Tracy Carlson, and Margaret Epperson.

Mayor Sallie Buck led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Sallie Buck called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Bill No: 35-2018 Certification of Election Results: Mayor Buck provided the election results as follows: Shawn D. Cowell 93 votes, John Carver 36 votes, and Gary Carlson 170 votes for the one position of Councilperson and there were 161 yes votes and 135 no votes cast for the Use Tax Proposition. Councilman Brammer moved Bill No. 35-2018 to certify the election electing Gary Carlson to the Council and the approval of the Use Tax be read twice by title only. Councilwoman Meissen seconded the motion. A voice vote carried the motion. City Clerk Krumpelman read Bill No. 35-2018 twice by title only. Councilman Brammer moved that Bill No. 35-2018 be approved. Councilwoman Meissen seconded the motion. The following roll call vote carried the motion: Councilman Brammer – aye, Councilwoman Meissen – aye, Councilwoman Cupp – aye, Mayor Buck– aye, and Councilman Holt– aye. This bill is assigned Ordinance Number 35.2019.

Recognition of Service: Mayor Buck presented Councilwoman Cupp with a plaque in recognition of her service to the City while serving as Councilwoman from April 2017 to June 2020.

Oath of Office: City Clerk Krumpelman gave the Oath of Office to newly elected Councilman Gary Carlson.

Mayor Selection: Councilwoman Meissen moved for Sallie Buck to serve as Mayor. Councilman Holt seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Pro-Tem Selection: Councilwoman Meissen moved for Tyson Brammer to serve as Mayor Pro-Tem. Councilman Holt seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Bank Account Signatures: After an initial motion was made by Councilwoman Meissen, but it failed due to lack of second as it was made known that the bank signatures do not change since Mayor Buck was re-elected as Mayor.

4th of July Discussion: Councilman / Fire Chief Holt stated that the 4th of July weeklong Celebration including the Carnival is cancelled due to complications caused by requirements due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Councilman / Fire Chief Holt stated the Fire Department has decided to serve hamburgers from the Fire Department from 2:00 pm to 8:00 pm on the 4th of July and will be shooting off fireworks at 9:30 pm on the 4th of July as well. He explained they are working with other groups to possibly provide other food items during the day and that evening. Councilman / Fire Chief Holt described the route for service and requested Santa Fe Ave be made one-lane for that day and blocked off to provide an emergency lane in case they need to respond to a fire. He also stated they may want to close streets around the Country Club for the Fireworks as well. Council provided consensus to allow the temporary closures / one-lane designated associated with the July 4th events. Mayor Buck stated she is glad the Fire Department is doing something that day.

City Manager Hoon stated the shelter houses, playgrounds and City Hall will all open back up to the public on June 15th regardless whether the state moves to Phase 2 or not.

At 6:19 pm Councilwoman Brammer moved to adjourn. Councilwoman Meissen seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
