

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE MARCELINE CITY COUNCIL
September 09, 2020

The Marceline City Council met in special session on September 09, 2020 at 4:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, Mayor Sallie Buck presiding. Council members present were Jeri Holt, Gary Carlson and Lacey Meissen (arrived at 4:34pm). Councilman Tyson Brammer was absent. Staff attending: City Attorney William Devoy, City Manager Richard Hoon, and City Clerk Lindsay Krumpelman.

Mayor Sallie Buck led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance and called the meeting to order at 4:30 pm.

PART TIME POSITION: City Manager Hoon informed the Council that Charles Harrington was appointed to the Electric Superintendent position. City Manager Hoon stated retired Electric Superintendent Dean Gauthier would like to work part-time for the City during the new Superintendent's probationary period. He stated the position would be a limit of an average of 20 hours per week and is currently budgeted at \$20.00 per hour, although Dean Gauthier requested \$25.00 per hour. Councilman Carlson inquired on benefits. City Clerk Krumpelman stated at the 20 hours per week average, the position is not eligible for benefits. The Council discussed the project. Councilman Holt moved to approve a part-time Electric Lineman position at \$20.00 per hour for an average of 20 hours per week effective on or after Monday, September 14, 2020 to be filled by Dean Gauthier. Councilman Carlson seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following roll call vote: Councilman Holt – aye, Councilman Carlson – aye, Mayor Buck – aye, and Councilwoman Meissen – aye.

At 74:37 pm Councilman Holt moved to adjourn to Executive Session pursuant to RSMo 610.021 Paragraph (3) Personnel and Paragraph (9) Employee Groups and to include guest Denise Delcore via phone. Councilman Carlson seconded the motion. The following roll call vote carried the motion: Councilman Holt – aye, Councilman Carlson – aye, Councilwoman Meissen – aye, and Mayor Buck – aye.
