Bulky Waste Guidelines

What is Bulky Waste? A piece of furniture or waste material from a residential source with a weight or volume greater than that allowed in carts, bags or cans.

When is Curbside Bulky Waste Collection?

Residential curbside bulky waste collection will take place in May and November. Dates will be negotiated between the City and Advanced Disposal.

Who qualifies for curbside Bulky Waste Collection?

Active residential customers within the boundaries of the City of Marceline that receive a garbage collection charge on their water bill.

Where should Bulky Waste placed for Collection?

Bulky Waste should be placed curbside next to regular garbage on the date designated for cleanup. All items should be placed curbside by 6:00am the day of scheduled collection, or the night prior.

What Bulky Waste items are accepted?

Items with special requirements for curbside collection:

Toilets must have tank removed from base and set beside for collection.

Carpet must be cut into 4'x4' sections and tied Carpet Pad must be cut into 4'x4' sections and tied

Barbeque Grills propane tanks removed Push Mowers gas and oil removed

Mirrors taped and contained in such a way that it will not explode when crushing

What Bulky Waste items are not accepted within this program?

Hazardous Material (eg. propane tanks, chemicals, oil, gas, etc.) Tires
Yard Waste & Vegetation Auto Parts

Liquids (cooking oil, chemicals, paint, etc.)

Construction or Demolition Material

Banned materials by law

^{**}For curbside collection all absorbent items must be dry for collection due to weight restrictions.

^{**}Construction or Demolition Material is considered waste building materials resulting from construction, remodeling, repair or demolition operations.
